At the March Town Council meeting:


Louis Linn was reappointed to a 3 year term on the Fletcher ABC Board.

Eric Rufa, Planning and Zoning Director, presented an overview of Henderson County Tourism Development Authority's Wayfinding Signage Program. Three signs will be dedicated to the Town of Fletcher should the Town choose to participate. After discussion, council members agreed to address this program during the upcoming budget workshop.

Council members held discussion on creating a signage policy for the Fletcher Community Park.

Tar Heel Paving was approved as the lowest responsible bidder for the Town's street resurfacing project. Bagwell Mill, Cliff Rose Court, Tulip Tree Court, Carolina Holly Way, and Westfield were all approved for resurfacing.

Council members will hold a workshop on March 22nd to discuss the Town budget for the Fiscal Year 2016/2017.



With mowing underway, we would like to remind residents to mow, blow and dispose of yard clippings in appropriate ways. Clippings should not be swept into streets and drainage sewers where they can clog storm drains and produce rainwater backups,



In addition, blowing grass clippings from a fertilized lawn into streets and drainage systems poses a potential risk to aquatic life, since the material can be carried into our creeks and ponds during a rain storm. Use caution when applying fertilizer combined with herbicide, especially with broadcast spreaders. Many fertilizers, especially those with herbicides are water soluble. Being water soluble, they

are easily leached out of soil with rain and watering, and so may pollute water sources.

A beautiful lawn is nice, but not at the expense of damaging the environment!

TRASH TALK

Bagged leaf pickup will take place the first 2 Mondays in April—April 4th and April 11th. Bag your leaves and call for pickup before Monday morning to Town Hall at 687-3985 or Public Works at 654-9208. Leave a message with your request of a leaf pickup and your address. Leaves will be composted so NO STICKS, DIRT, or ROCKS, pampas grass, or mulch!



Starting to mow? The Town does not pick up grass clippings. We recommend that you use mulching blades and return the clippings to the yard or compost them. If you must dispose of the clippings, the Hen-

derson County Transfer station located at 802 Stoney Mountain Road will accept these materials. There is a fee for the disposal.

Please follow the guidelines for trash disposal using the rollout cans! All trash must be bagged within the roll-out trash receptacle! This is to prevent trash from blowing out when the can is lifted into the truck. If Public Works employees discover the contents are not bagged, they will tag the can and not pick up the contents! Do not leave bags of trash outside of the rolling carts or leave the carts in the roadway.



The Town does not pickup televisions, computer components, grills, or other items. These items are not allowed in landfills in North Carolina and must be disposed of at the Henderson County Convenience Center on Stoney Mountain Road. Some electronics retailers offer in-store drop-off programs for electronics of all kinds, from computers to fax machines. Some offer recycling kiosks for items such as ink and toner cartridges, rechargeable batteries, cords, and cables, and will accept most electronic gear at the customer service counters.

Did you know:

In February, this department collected 143.5 tons of solid waste—an average of 8.97 tons per day. This required 325.42 gallons of fuel. This department also chipped 105 cubic yards of mulch from brush collected in the town.
