At the January Town Council meeting:

Council members approved a Grant Project Ordinance for Highway 25 Corridor Improvements.

Funds were approved for a greenway conceptual design. This would support extension of the greenway and the connection to other Town property.

A Capital Project Ordinance was also approved for a Parks and Recreation and Public Works vehicle shed construction project. John Legerton of Legerton Architecture—architect for the upcoming building project—was introduced to council members.

Mark Cathey with McGill & Associates presented an update on the design schedule for Highway 25 Corridor Improvements.

Mark Biberdorf, Town Manager, presented highlights from a facility study commissioned by the New Fletcher Library Partners. The study shows that the Fletcher branch of the Henderson County Public Library was the busiest in the system with an annual number of visitors to the facility close to 80,000. This branch serves an area of over 20,000 people with more than 60% of the users from outside of the Fletcher municipal limits. The study addresses the fact that the current library branch lacks space for services and parking is limited. It recommends a larger facility to accommodate the growing area's needs for the coming years.



It is winter and that can bring a variety of weather conditions! Every winter weather event is unique and the actions taken for each storm are directly related to the amount and type of the precipitation, the ground

and air temperature, and the pending forecast. All of these variables create their own unique challenges! And a successful battle against the winter weather event requires the cooperation and assistance of the citizens.

The Town's Public Works Department's goal during a weather event is to provide for the safety of the Town's residents. If snow and ice are predicted, please don't park on Town streets! This will help crews travel through streets and clean snow more efficiently and safely.

Trash pickup and recycling pickup schedules may be altered. Please have patience! As soon as roads are clear for emergency vehicles and travel, the Public Works department will make decisions as to rescheduling solid waste removal.

Residents will be alerted as to the changes through its automated call system. If you are not receiving the automated calls, please go to the Town's website www.fletchernc.org—contact us link or call Town Hall at 687-3985 to be added.

Planning Board/ZBA Vacancy District 1

The Fletcher Planning Board and Zoning Board of Adjustment currently has an opening for the recently vacated District One seat. Any District One resident interested in applying for this vacancy may download the application form at Fletchernc.org or obtain a form by contacting the Town of Fletcher at (828) 687-3985. District One generally covers the eastern side of Fletcher from the industrial district into the Hooper's Creek area. The Planning Board/ZBA serves in dual functions. Planning Board duties include reviews of rezoning requests, special use permits and conditional district requests, as well as text amendments to the Fletcher Land Development Code. ZBA duties cover variance requests and appeals. The Board typically meets on the third Tuesday of the month at 6:00 PM. This is a volunteer position and is appointed by the Fletcher Town Council.

TRASH TALK



Please follow the guidelines for trash disposal using the roll-out cans! All trash **must be bagged** within the roll-out trash receptacle! This is to prevent trash from blowing out when the can is lifted into the truck. If Public Works employees discover the contents are not bagged, they will tag the can and not pick up the

contents! **Do not leave bags of trash outside of the rolling carts or leave the carts in the roadway.** Public Works employees have encountered a continuing problem with residents leaving loose trash or additional bags or boxes of trash placed beside the rolling trash cans.

Bagged leaf pick up ended at the end of December. This department will not pick up leaves again until the first 2 Mondays in April—April 3rd and April 10th. If you must dispose of leaves, you may take them to the Henderson County transfer station on Stoney Mountain Road. There is a charge for disposal of leaves at that facility.

You may now request a brush pickup online! Go to the Town website—www.fletchernc.org—and you may access the link either from the "How do I" link at the top or through the Public Works department link. Brush pick up does start on Monday mornings (unless it is a holiday) and pick up request must be in before Monday morning.

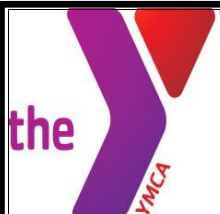
From the Tax Collector:



Taxes are due upon receipt and delinquent if not paid by January 5, 2017. Interest was posted on all delinquent property taxes January 6, 2017. The tax lien attaches to the property on January 1st of the taxing year and is not affected by transfer of title, death, or bankruptcy of the owner. Enforced collection procedures can begin on all delinquent accounts and are subject to garnishment of wages, attachment of bank accounts, levy on personal property, and foreclosure proceedings. Delinquent taxes will be advertised on **March 22, 2017** in the Times News newspaper and advertisement charges will be added to all delinquent accounts.

Tax payments may be mailed to 300 Old Cane Creek Road, or paid in person at Town Hall, Monday—Friday, 8 a.m.—5 p.m. A drop box is located for “after hours” payments in the south side parking lot of Town Hall. It is monitored by surveillance cameras 24 hours a day. Or you may pay taxes online at our Town website www.fletchernc.org. You will need your roll number from your tax bill and your checking account number. The Town does not accept credit or debit cards.

There are programs available to disabled, disabled veterans, and elderly that can help to lower property tax bills. Contact Henderson County Assessor’s office to apply for tax relief. If the taxpayer qualifies for tax relief, then the information is forwarded to the Town of Fletcher where Town taxes will be lowered as well as County taxes. Deadline to file tax relief forms is **June 1, 2017**.
