At the March Town Council meeting:

Sandra Anderson was appointed to the Parks & Recreation Advisory Board for a 3 year term to expire in March 2020. Larry Waldrop was reappointed to the ABC Board for another 3 year term to expire in April 2020.

Council members approved a contract with Equinox Environmental for a park master plan for the Meritor property .

Lew Bleiweis, Asheville Regional Airport Executive Director, reported on updates to the airport's air service and construction progress.

A Public Hearing was held to consider an amendment to the Land Development Code regarding the number of allowed residential structures on an individual lot. After discussion, the amendment was approved.

Autumn Radcliff, Henderson County Senior Planner, was present and updated council members on some Apple Country Transit statistics and budget requests for the coming fiscal year.

TRASH TALK



Spring clean up of bagged leaves will be the 1st two Mondays of April—April 3 and April 10th. Rake and bag your leaves and call for pick up or go to the Town website *www.fletchernc.org* and enter a work order for pick up!

You may now request a brush pickup online! Go to the Town website—-*www.fletchernc.org*—and you may access the link either from the "How do I" link at the top or through the Public Works department link. Brush pick up does start on Monday mornings (unless it is a holiday) and pick up request must be in before Monday morning.

Please follow the guidelines for trash disposal using the roll-out cans! All trash <u>must be</u> <u>bagged</u> within the roll-out trash receptacle! This is to prevent trash from blowing out when the can is lifted into the truck. If Public Works



employees discover the contents are not bagged, they will tag the can and not pick up the contents! **Do not leave bags of trash outside of the rolling carts or leave the carts in the roadway.** Public Works employees have encountered a continuing problem with residents leaving loose trash or additional bags or boxes of trash placed beside the rolling trash cans. Due to recent high winds, employees have been physically laying the trash cans down to keep the wind from blowing them into the road. We ask that you write your address on the lid of your trash cart with an indelible marker to help you identify your cart.

Storm Water Facts

Stormwater runoff is water from rain or melting snow that "runs off" across the land instead of seeping into the ground. This runoff usually flows into the nearest stream, creek, river, or

lake. On its way, runoff can pick up and carry many substances that pollute water. These include pesticides, fertilizers, oil, pet waste, leaves, and grass clippings. It also include sediment from construction, bare soil, dirt roads, or agricultural lands.

Runoff is also created by watering, car-washing, hosing down decks or pavement, or any other activity that puts a lot of water on the ground.

In addition to picking up pollutants from the land, stormwater runoff also gets polluted from dumping in storm drains, and from illegal (illicit) hook-ups to the pipes that carry rainwater to the streams.

The Town has an ordinance to prevent these "illicit discharges". To learn more about ways you can prevent stormwater pollution, please visit the Town's website at *www.fletchernc.org* and click on the *storm water management* link under the Planning and Zoning Department tab.

Did you know?

There are programs available to disabled, disabled veterans, and elderly to help lower property tax bills.

All applicants must complete Form AV-9 which is available on the North Carolina Department of Revenue's website or at the Henderson County Assessor's office. After completion of the form, it is submitted to the county assessor's office at 200 N. Grove Street, Hendersonville. If the taxpayer qualifies for tax relief, then the information is forwarded to the Town of Fletcher where Town taxes will lowered as well as County Taxes.

The deadline for filing for tax relief for the 2017 property taxes is June 1, 2017. Any applications received after that date will not be considered.
