## At the November Town Council meeting:

Council members set a public hearing for November 13, 2017, in order to consider an application for "The Groves at Town Center"—a 168 unit apartment complex at 35 Howard Gap Road.

A resolution was approved for Fletcher Police Department to receive a grant in the amount of \$39,000 from the NC Governor's Highway Safety Program.

Mark Biberdorf, Town Manager, updated Council on the bidding schedules for the road resurfacing and drainage improvements at the Fletcher Community Park. He also updated Council members on the Parks & Recreation Maintenance building project.

Councilwoman, Sheila Franklin, was appointed to the Henderson County Water & Sewer Advisory Committee.

**Bagged leaf pickup** will continue every Monday until the end of December.

Work orders for pickup need to be entered online at the Town's website

www.fletchernc.org, under the "How Do I?" link at the top right side of the home page. Work orders may also be called into Public Works at 654-9208 and leave a message with request and address, or call Town Hall at 687-3985. Work orders must be placed **before** Mondays of each week for pick up that week.

Leaves need to be bagged and at curbside by 7:00 a.m. Please no grass clippings, pampas grass, mulch, dirt, or rocks are allowed as leaves will be composted!

Please don't rake or blow leaves to the curb or into the streets to wash into storm drains. This is an annual problem that causes major issues for drainage systems.

So rake 'em, bag 'em, and call for pickup or go online to place a work order!



Property tax payments may be mailed to 300 Old Cane Creek Road, or paid in person at Town Hall, Monday—Friday, 8 a.m.—5 p.m. A drop box is located for "after hours" pay-

ments in the south side parking lot of Town Hall. It is monitored by surveillance cameras 24 hours a day. Or a resident may view and/or pay their Town taxes online. At the Town's website: www.fletchernc.org, go to the "How do I?" link at the top right side of the home page. You will need your roll number or account from your tax bill and your bank routing and checking account numbers. The Town of Fletcher does not accept credit or debit cards.

Partial payments may be made, but must be paid in full by January 5, 2018 to avoid penalties and interest.

Taxing governments in North Carolina are not legally obligated to furnish property owners a tax notice. It is the responsibility of the citizen to know that they owe taxes in that jurisdiction—just as you know that you are responsible for state and federal income taxes. We make every effort to get notices to the correct address, but the tax obligation still exists even if the taxpayer does not receive a bill!

#### TRASH TALK

Please follow the guidelines for trash disposal using the roll-out cans! All trash <u>must be bagged</u> within the roll-out trash receptacle! This is to prevent trash from blowing out when the can is lifted into the truck. If Public Works employees discover the contents are not bagged, they will tag the can and not pick up the contents! Do not leave bags of trash outside of the rolling carts or leave the carts in the roadway. Public Works employees have encountered a continuing problem with residents leaving loose trash or additional bags or boxes of trash placed beside the rolling trash cans. Due to recent high winds, employees have been physically laying the trash cans down to keep the wind from blowing them into the road. We ask that you write your address on the lid of your trash cart with an indelible marker to help you identify your cart.

You may now request a brush pickup online! Go to the Town website—www.fletchernc.org—and you may access the link either from the "How do I" link at the top or through the Public Works department link. Brush pick up does start on Monday mornings (unless it is a holiday) and pick up requests must be in before Monday morning.

We cannot chip lumber, railroad ties, building materials, telephone poles, or fence posts. Any brush piles containing these materials will be not be picked up. Please remember, brush pick-up is provided as a free service to our residents who are cleaning up the yard around their house. It is not to remove bushes, stumps, trees, and other debris resulting from plant removal, lot clearing, pool installation, construction, additions, new decks, etc. Removal of debris resulting from these activities should be arranged by the homeowner or the contractor at their expense.

Please be considerate of our employees and do not place any poison ivy or oak vines or briars in the brush piles. Severe allergic reactions are possible.

The Town does not pick up grass clippings or yard waste such as pampas grass. These materials can not be put into a wood chipper and are not allowed in the landfills with household waste. If you must dispose of materials such as this, you may take them to the Henderson County Convenience Center. There is a charge for disposal of these materials.

The Town of Fletcher will honor its Veterans on Saturday, November 11<sup>th</sup> at 8:30 a.m. with its Annual Veterans' Day Salute and Breakfast. This event will be held at Fletcher Town Hall, located at 300 Old Cane Creek Rd. This year's Salute will feature a flag retirement ceremony, a musical performance by students in the West Henderson High School Band, and keynote speaker Clarence Dotson, a World War II Veteran of the United States Army. Mr. Dotson, a Fairview NC native. was drafted into the United States Army in 1943 as an Army Mechanic. On March 23, 1944 Clarence was sent to Normandy at Utah Beach where he served with the 1st Army, 90th Division under General Omar Bradley. After completing his service, Mr. Dotson, returned home and married Frances Frady and had 2 daughters. The World War II Veteran retired from Deal Buick after 30 years of service as the Service Manager. Clarence Dotson currently serves with the Buncombe County Memorial Team and will be discussing "Experience of War" during his key note address.
