Council Information

The Town of Fletcher is governed by a Mayor and a four-member Council. All are elected in non-partisan races held in odd numbered years and serve four-year staggered terms. The Town has chosen the Council/Manager form of government which generally gives policy-making responsibility to the Council and administrative responsibilities, including personnel decisions, to the Manager. The Manager and the elected officials work hand in hand to develop sound policies, plans and financial decisions. Town Council meetings and agenda meetings are open to the public. Council members conduct agenda meetings on the 1st Monday at 6:00 p.m.; regular meetings are on the 2nd Monday at 7:00 p.m. The Town's website publishes the agenda online before every meeting.

Property Taxes

Fletcher is a municipality that provides additional services to Fletcher residents. Anyone living within the town limits currently pays property taxes based on an annually-established rate per \$100 of the assessed value. Fletcher residents pay property taxes to Henderson County as well.

Fletcher taxes support police and fire protection, garbage pickup, brush pick-up, seasonal leaf collection, street maintenance, recycling, street lighting, land use regulation and code enforcement, as well as use of the Town's parks and a reduced rate on recreational activities. You may pay your tax bill in person at Fletcher Town Hall, by mail, or by utilizing our E-Gov services (online payment via check). Please visit www.fletchernc.org for additional information.

Planning & Zoning

The Fletcher Planning & Zoning Department oversees review and approval for new development in the Town of Fletcher. Basically, all new development, from adding a deck to a house to large scale commercial development, requires a zoning permit from the Town before a building permit can be obtained from Henderson



County. The department also administers regulations for development in the floodplain, as well as permits for new signs. The department also handles enforcement of all zoning and land use related codes in the Land Development Code, the Junked Vehicle Ordinance, and the Solid Waste Ordinance. The Town of Fletcher Police Department is comprised of 17 sworn officers and 1 civilian employee. We provide police services to the Town 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. Our calls for service are dispatched through the Henderson County Sheriff's Department, and our department consists of 3 units: Patrol, Investigations, and Administration/Support. Administrative office hours are Monday through Friday, 8am to 5pm. We are located on the lower level, north side parking lot of Fletcher Town Hall.

Our police department is committed to continually enhancing the quality of life in our community and keeping Fletcher a safe place to raise a family. Over the past several years, the Fletcher Police Department has received a SafeWise Top 20 ranking as being one of the safest cities in North Carolina. We have accomplished this because of a strong and active partnership between our department and members of our community.

We offer a Vacation House Check Program which is designed to provide peace of mind to our residents while they are away from home for extended periods of time. After a resident has completed and turned in the required form, our officers attempt to make periodic checks on your residence while it is vacant. The emergency contact information you provide allows us to contact you or your designee in the event that the residence may need attention. This program is a public service to help safeguard citizens' property and allow for a rapid response and owner notification in the event of a problem. The form is available on the Town's website and can be submitted electronically or can be completed in person at our department.

We welcome your ideas, time and talents in helping us advance such partnerships and to continue to keep our community safe. Please utilize the Town's website to stay informed. Thank you for your interest in the Fletcher Police Department, and we greatly appreciate your support.

The Town of Fletcher Public Works

Garbage Pickup - Public Works provides garbage pickup weekly for residential homeowners. Only household waste will be collected, and all trash must be bagged and placed in the container provided by the Town. Please have your receptacle curbside by 7:00 am. To find out your day of collection, call either Town Hall at 687.3985 or Public Works at 654.9208. Public Works will provide special needs pickup for residents who require assistance. You may contact the Public Works Department to arrange for this service.

Recycling - Recycling is provided to residential homeowners through a private contractor bi-weekly, and recycling bins are provided by the Town. No separation of recyclables is required, but all cardboard needs to be broken down flat and placed underneath the recycle bins. Please place the bins curbside by 7:00 am. To find out your day of collection, call either Town Hall at 828.687.3985 or Public Works at 828.654.9208. You can also contact Curbside with any questions or concerns at 828.252.2532.

Brush Pickup - On a weekly basis, Public Works provides brush pickup. All brush work orders must be received by 7:00 am Monday morning, and those received later than 7:00 am will be picked up the following week. Only brush will be chipped. No root balls, dirt or grass will be collected. This service is for residential use only; no commercial cuts will be accepted. Please call either Public Works or Town Hall to submit a work order, or you can submit a work order online. Simply go to www.fletchernc.org, and in the top right corner of the home page click "How Do I" and select request a brush/leaf pickup. There you will be able to enter your work order electronically.

Leaf Pickup - Seasonal leaf pickup is provided from the first Monday in October through the last Monday in December and the first two Mondays in April. All leaf work orders must be received by 7:00 am Monday morning. All leaves must be bagged and free of all sticks and any other debris. Please call either Public Works or Town Hall to submit a work order or you can submit a work order online. Simply go to www.fletchernc.org and in the top right corner of the home page click "How Do I" and select request a brush/leaf pickup. There you will be able to enter your work order electronically.

Streets - Public Works is responsible for all street maintenance on those streets under the Town's control. Maintenance includes replacement of street signs, street sweeping, pothole patching, and drainage maintenance. Public Works also prioritizes street conditions for resurfacing needs. The prioritization of street resurfacing projects is done on an annual basis. To report a problem with your street, call the Public Works Dept. at 828.654.9208.
