News from the February Town Council Meeting:

The 2018 year-end Tax Collector's report was approved along with March 27, 2019 being set as the date to advertise delinquent tax payers in the *Times News* per NCGS-105-369.

Town Council held a public hearing to consider SUP Application #2018-01 for a 6-unit Planned Residential Development at 50 St. John's Road. Eric Rufa, Planning & Zoning Director, gave a project overview. Engineer Marty Kocot shared design plans and answered Council questions along with Developer, Keith Reed. A Council motion was made and passed to approve SUP Application #2018-01.

Town Manager, Mark Biberdorf, reviewed the options explored thus far for a new Parks & Recreation Maintenance building. He is now exploring an additional option of extending Old Cane Creek Road to Howard Gap Road and building a maintenance building fronting Old Cane Creek Road extension. No decisions were made by the Town Council.

Mark Biberdorf shared there is nothing new on the exploratory discussion of an EMS station on town owned property nor any updates on the Town Center project.

Mr. Biberdorf provided updates on the following:

◆ Park flood damage repair work - Stone is being added to the greenway trails beginning 2/18/19; Blue Ghost Brewery silent auction reported approximately \$1500 in proceeds with final totals pending; and 2/26/19 is the opening date for bids for the Powell bill project and paving the trails.

◆ I-26 widening project - A traffic management plan is being conducted to minimize traffic impact. This 5-year project will be let for bids in May or June. It will add one lane from exit 53 to exit 44 for a total of 6 lanes and then add 2 lanes from Fletcher to the I-40/I-240 exchange for a total of 8 lanes. There is also plans for a Hwy 25/I-26 overpass that includes a diverging diamond interchange.

• Bicycle Pedestrian planning grant - It has been approved pending our official notification.

♦ Motor vehicle checkpoints - Our Police checkpoints are conducted according to NC General Statue requirements to help prevent unlicensed and unsafe drivers on our streets.

◆ Fiscal year 2019-2020 budget requests are due February 22nd from Department heads with our Budget workshop scheduled for March 20, 2019.

PUBLIC WORKS Q & A

How can I get my brush picked up?

Public Works picks up brush and tree/hedge trimmings that are no longer than 6' and 6" in diameter stacked neatly in a pile along the curbside by Town of Fletcher residents. Due to our new brush grappler truck, the placement of your brush is critical. It should be stacked at least 20' from overhead lines and cannot be placed in a ditch, against other trees or shrubs, near phone pedestals, on top of water meters, near cars, or in any place that prevents the grappler arm from safely operating. Please keep in mind that grass clippings, stumps, grassy debris, or items with dirt on it will not be picked up. The Town also will not pick up brush cleared by a hired professional since removing that debris is part of their service. 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2019 Henderson County Tax Reappraisal Update

* NOTE: Dates are subject to change.

January - April 2019	Informal Appeals are heard by the Assessor until the Board of Equalization & Review convenes
April 15, 2019	The Board of Equalization & Review convenes to accept Formal Appeals
May 15, 2019	The Board of Equalization & Review adjourns and closes the appeal period

As a Henderson county resident, you should have already received your property tax reappraisal notice. If you are now asking, "What if I disagree with my value?", Henderson County Tax Department shares this information:

If a tax payer thinks an appeal is warranted due to: **(1)** the assessed value being substantially higher/lower than the market value of the property <u>or</u> **(2)** if the property has been appraised inequitably as it relates to the market value of comparable properties, there is an established 5-step appeal process. First, an Informal Appeal form must be completed which is included in your 2019 Notice of Assessed Value or can be obtained from <u>www.hendersoncountync.gov/tax/page/2019-reappraisal</u> or by contacting the Assessor's Office at (828) 697-4667. According to North Carolina law, the property owner has the burden of proving the property under appeal is incorrectly valued. The Tax Department's website contains tax appraisal values and property information for all parcels within the County. This tool can be used to compare values or property characteristics within your neighborhood. Access this site by visiting <u>www.hendersoncountync.gov</u> and choosing "Government", "Tax Offices", "Online Tools", then "Search Real Property Data". Because tax values are based on market value, also review recent sales in your area as a comparison to the value of your property. Your Informal Appeal and your supporting documentation, must be returned prior to April 15th when the Board of Equalization & Review convenes. Your appeal will be thoroughly reviewed by an appraiser and you will be notified of the review results by mail even if it is the same, an increase, or decrease in value. The tax payer may then accept the value or file a Formal Appeal, from April 15th to May15th, to the County's Board of Equalization & Review by contacting the Assessor's Office at (828) 697-4667. The remaining three steps involve appealing to the NC Property Tax Commission, the NC Court of Appeals, and the State Supreme Court.
