News from the March Town Council Meeting:

The Town Council took action on the following:

- Approved Resolution R-19-01 in support of the municipal agreement and match for the Town of Fletcher Bicycle/Pedestrian plan
- Approved Proclamation P-19-01 in support of Spring Litter Sweep from 4/13/19 4/27/19
- Approved Budget Amendments #4 and #5 to the 2018/2019 FY Budget Ordinance
- Set a Public Hearing for April 8, 2019 to consider potential amendments to the Fletcher Land Development Code
- Approved Jan Linville to join the Parks & Recreation Advisory Board for a 3-year term to expire in March 2021
- Appointed Councilman Bob Davy as a representative to the French Broad River MPO and to the Henderson County Transportation Advisory Committee
- Approved select property tax releases as provided by the Henderson County Tax Office
- Approved JLS as the lowest responsible bidder for street resurfacing projects (\$198.857) and resurfacing payed trails and drainage at Bill Moore Community Park (\$131,692). \$20,000 was approved to be used for the park work from existing Park Development Funds. Budget amendments will be prepared in April to cover the unbudgeted cost of both projects.

Public Works Director, Jabbo Pressley, reported encouraging environmental and fiscal benefits from the recycling cart program implemented in fall of 2018. From Nov 2017 - Feb 2018 as compared to the same 2018/2019 timeframe, we experienced a 27% increase in recycling volume and a 2.7% decrease in municipal solid waste tonnage.

Town Manager, Mark Biberdorf, provided an update on the Town Center project, reported the Henderson County property tax revaluation resulted in an initial 21% increase in property values with an actual 18.7% increase, reminded the Council of the March 20th Budget Workshop, and shared that the SmartTrac Economic Incentive Agreement had been sent to the company.

During the Public Comment section, citizen Stan Moore spoke in favor of a new Fletcher Library and encouraged Town fiscal support in the upcoming budget.

Spring Safety Tips for walkers, runners, bikers

Assume that drivers cannot see you so wear reflective clothing. Never run or walk more than 2-abreast, walk facing traffic, and keep as close as possible to the shoulder of the road.

Bicyclists should ride single file, travel with traffic, obey the same traffic rules and signs as vehicles, and use proper hand signals. Always wear a helmet and don't wear headphones so you can hear approaching traffic.

Be attentive to lighting conditions. It's harder for drivers to see during dusk and dawn. Remember that sun glare is a factor in many accidents.

Keep a cell phone with your Emergency Contact info as a cell phone contact. It will assist emergency personnel in case you are involved in an accident.

When driving, remember that runners, walkers, and bicyclists are using the roads too. Pay attention to your surroundings and help keep our Town streets safe!

Last leaf pickup until fall...

Help us help you...with your garbage

Each household has been assigned a 92-gallon trash receptacle for *household waste*. Trash must be *bagged* inside the can and the *bag secured* to prevent spillage. Unfortunately, we cannot pick up loose items such as TV's, furniture, remodeling materials, grass clippings, carpet scraps, etc. Items such as these should be taken to the Henderson County Convenience Center or the Henderson County Transfer Station. Working in the yard and need a brush pick up?

Public Works will pick up brush and tree/hedge trimmings no longer than 6' and 6" in diameter stacked neatly in a pile along the curbside. Due to our new brush grappler truck, the placement of your brush is critical. It should be stacked at least 20' from overhead lines and cannot be placed in a ditch, against other trees or shrubs, near phone pedestals, on top of water meters, near cars, or in any place that prevents the grappler arm from safely operating. Grass clippings, stumps, items with dirt on them, or brush cleared by a hired professional will not be picked up. Stormwater Runoff...a concern for all of us

Stormwater runoff is water from rain or melting snow that "runs off" across the land instead of seeping into the ground. Runoff is also created from watering trees or vegetation, washing vehicles, cleaning decks or pavement, or any activity that puts a lot of water onto the ground or pavement quickly. This runoff usually flows into the nearest stream, creek, river, or lake. On its way, runoff can pick up and carry many substances that pollute water such as pesticides, fertilizers, oil, pet waste, leaves, and grass clippings. Another common stormwater pollutant is sediment from construction sites, bare soil, dirt roads, or agricultural lands.

In addition to picking up pollutants from the land, stormwater runoff is also polluted by dumping into storm drains and from illegal (illicit) hookups to the pipes that carry rainwater to the streams. The Town of Fletcher has an ordinance to prevent these "illicit discharges".
