News from the May Town Council Meeting

- Danny Pena was welcomed as the Town's newest Maintenance Specialist in our Public Works Department.
- Captain Bengy Bryant from the Henderson County Sherriff's Department was introduced as our new Town of Fletcher community liaison.
- The Town Council took action on the following matters:
 - Approved property tax releases from the Henderson County Tax Office
 - Set June 10, 2019, as a Public Hearing to consider CD# 2019-02 and SUP# 2019-01 for a 311-unit planned residential development at 150 Cane Creek Road
 - Approved Resolution R-19-04 to sell surplus property on www.govdeals.com
 - Approved Budget Amendment #8 to the 2018/2019 Budget Ordinance
 - Approved Pay Classification Study recommendations
- Tyler Brisbon, Founder of WNC Superheroes, shared an overview of their non-profit organization and their efforts to seek sponsorship funding. No action was taken by Council.
- Rob Settle, broker with Commercial Carolina, provided an update on the Fletcher Town Center project. No action was taken by Council.
- Mark Biberdorf, Town Manager, discussed the success of our April Pill Drop/Shred Event and the upcoming close of the 2019/2020 budget planning process with its discussion at the June Council meeting.

New Fletcher Library Update

The New Fletcher Library Partners (NFLP) is a nonprofit organization that formed to raise awareness and funding for a new library facility to be built in Fletcher. The current branch facility, located next to Kate's Park, has outgrown its existing location and is in need of frequent repairs to the building. The NFLP is working to raise funds from Henderson County, the Town of Fletcher, and private donors to build a 15,000 square foot building in the Fletcher Town Center area located on Old Cane Creek Road.

The NFLP meets on a bi-monthly basis at Fletcher Town Hall. The NFLP is also raising funds for construction costs that are being received by the Community Foundation of Henderson County in a special account.

Frequently asked questions...

Traffic Light at Fanning Bridge/Hwy 25

Yes, NC Dot has changed this signal light pattern. Due to the current construction on Hendersonville Road, DOT has made a temporary change to increase traffic flow on Hendersonville Road. They have varied the timing cycle so that at certain times during the day, it is similar to the timing we are accustomed to while at other times only a few vehicles can make it through the light. When construction is over, we anticipate the signal pattern being changed back. During this interim period, you may wish to find another route to avoid delays. Thank you for your patience during this time.

The Land of Sky Regional Council and WestNGN Broadband are still at work on the broadband initiative and are seeking additional input to help them better understand and support the Internet needs of Henderson county residents. Parks & Recreation Fee Refund Policy

Shelter Rental Reservations: Reservation fees are non-refundable. Every effort will be made to schedule an alternate date should a cancellation be necessary. Alternate dates may or may not be available depending upon other confirmed reservations. In case of inclement weather, the park user has 2 working days to call and schedule an alternate date.

Summer Camp: The \$25 per week registration fee is non-refundable. Camp fees are refundable only upon receipt of a written request under the following conditions, however no refund will be given if your child is excused from camp due to behavior issues: 15+ days prior to the camp week = 75% refund; 14 - 7 days prior to the camp week = 50% refund; 6 - 0 days prior to the camp week = no refund.

Backyard Chickens

Currently there are no regulations in the Town of Fletcher Land Development Code that prohibits a homeowner from having chickens nor is a permit required. However, we do recommend citizens be good neighbors. For example: (1) You do not need a rooster to enjoy fresh eggs, plus it prevents noise issues with your neighbors; (2) Keep your chicken coops and/or enclosures away from adjoining property lines, and (3) Keep the area clean so odors do not become an issue. Thanks for helping to make Fletcher an enjoyable place to live.

PUBLIC WORKS (828) 654-9208

Need brush picked up? Call (828)654-9208 for pickup of brush and tree/hedge trimmings that are no larger than 6' X 6" stacked in a pile along your curbside and not placed under power lines. We do not accept brush that was commercially cut for you nor do we accept grass clippings. The Henderson County Transfer Station in Hendersonville accepts grass clippings for a fee. You may wish to consider utilizing mulching blades on your mower to return the clippings to the yard and avoid having to dispose of them.

<u>Disposal of white goods</u> - Public Works picks up and disposes of white goods for our residents (washers, dryers, refrigerators, microwaves, dishwashers, freezers, stoves). Call (828)654-9208 to arrange for a pickup.

<u>Disposal of other large items</u> - Public Works does not pick up large items such as TV's, furniture, lumber, grills, carpet, etc. These should be taken to the Henderson County Convenience Center or the Henderson County Transfer Station. 


Fletcher Summer Day Camp begins June 17th!
