News from the October Town Council Meeting

- Donnie Grindstaff & Martin O'Dell shared information about "Ride for Kids", a pediatric brain tumor fundraiser, and their November 2nd non-profit kickoff.
- * The Town Council took action on the following matters:
- Approved property tax releases from the Henderson County Tax Office.
- Approved Resolution R-19-09 regarding the financing terms and documents for the Economic Development Property Acquisition project.
- Approved Grace Deal to serve another 3-year term, expiring 11/22, on the Planning and Zoning Board.
- Approved Resolution R-19-10 to authorize and direct the Town Manager to engage outside counsel in certain quasi-judicial actions.
- * A public hearing was held to consider Rezoning # 2019-01 PIN # 9643-94-9427 from R-2 residential to C-2 commercial. Eric Rufa, Planning & Zoning Director gave a brief overview of the request, made by property owner Robert Lance, and shared that the Town Planning Board did not recommend re-zoning the property. The Town Council took no action on this request.
- * Mark Biberdorf, Town Manager, discussed the termination of the Economic Incentive Agreement with Continental Teves. The 2009 Agreement is still active but the 2013 Agreement stated that if the plant ceased operations before the end of the Incentive term, the agreement would be null and void. The plant closing is scheduled for 2022, thus it was agreed to terminate our Incentive Agreement.
- * Mark Biberdorf discussed amending Town Ordinance 0-05-03 regulating open burning within the Town limits. He presented two possible ordinance changes: 1) No burning within the Town limits or 2) No burning unless the property was 5+ acres in size and a burning permit had been issued. He also mentioned the existence of a NC Administrative Code that restricts burning if a municipality provides brush pickup. A motion was made, seconded, and approved to change the ordinance to ban outdoor burning and open burning within the Town of Fletcher. This burn ban largely prohibits the issuance of burn permits for burning brush piles, leaves/grass clippings, refuse, etc. It does not prohibit the use of campfires, and the like, intended for recreational or cooking purposes that are no larger than four square feet and are not within 25 feet of a structure or any property line.
- * Mark Biberdorf provided an update on several issues such as: 2019-2020 legislative priorities for the Town of Fletcher, progress on the distribution of recycling carts, ongoing Pressley Hill and Woodhill Drive traffic studies due to resident concerns, progress on the actuated warning signal at Wildbriar Road and Hoopers Creek, and our continued desire for the Highway 25 Streetscape Project to be completed by our contractor.

Fall Leaf Disposal...

With the beautiful fall leaf color comes the chore of raking leaves! Even though raking leaves can be a great workout (30 minutes of raking can burn about 150 calories) most people want to com-



plete this tedious task as soon as possible. However, please do not take the short cut disposal method of dumping your leaves down a storm drain or by placing loose leaves in a drainage ditch or in the gutter.



The Town of Fletcher has an ordinance prohibiting "illicit discharges" into the storm drain system. Leaves, brush, lawn clippings, and other yard waste are considered an illicit discharge that can affect

water quality. The town can issue fines to citizens who violate this ordinance.

There are several different ways to dispose of your leaves: (1) The Town offers bagged leaf collection every Monday during the fall. Rake your leaves, bag them, put them at the curbside, and call 828-654-9208 for pick up. (2) Use your lawn mower to reduce the leaves to small bits that can be left on the lawn as added nutrients for the soil. (3) Add the leaves to your mulch or compost pile. (4) Use them as a winter cover for your garden or kindling for your outdoor fire pit.

Please select a disposal method that will protect the water quality in Fletcher and minimize the effects of clogged storm drains from leaves and other debris. Thank you for helping our Town!

Recycling Cart Distribution Update

By now you should have received your new rolling recycling cart. If you did not receive a cart or the "Recycling Q&A" sheet that was attached to each cart and would like a cart or an info sheet, please contact us at 828-654-9208. Also if you are unsure of your recycling day, contact us at 828-687-3985. Remember, you do not have to fill your cart completely with recycling before sitting it at the curb every other week. Thanks for recycling!

Change in Recycling Shredded Paper

Due to a change in NC recycling guidelines for municipalities, recycling companies must now take measures to prevent the contamination of the glass stream. Since shredded paper is so small it easily gets mixed in with recycled glass. Consequently, recycling vendors must have special equipment to keep contamination from occurring or they can either accept shredded paper or they can accept glass for recycling but not both. Our vendor, Curbside Management, has decided to continue to accept glass for recycling and therefore we cannot accept shredded paper with your other recyclable materials. To dispose of your shredded paper, attend a shredding event (many banks offer them and our Town's event is typically in April) or some retail office supply stores allow their customers to bring in items to be shredded by their shredding vendor. Another disposal option is to bag it and include it in with your trash.

Free Mulch

If you need mulch to cover your plants during the fall or winter, don't forget we have free mulch stored at the Fletcher Municipal Complex property located on Parish Municipal Drive. It is in an open, easily accessible area and all you need to bring is a pitchfork or shovel along with a container and help yourself!



November 5th General Election Info

"One Stop Early Voting" for the General Election for Fletcher Districts 2 & 3 Town Council seats will be held through Friday, November 1, 2019 during regular office hours from 8:30am to 5:00pm at the Henderson County Board of Election Office located at 75 E. Central Street in Hendersonville.

Only registered voters of the Town of Fletcher are eligible to vote in the November 5th General Election and must go to their assigned precinct on Election Day to vote. If you have received notification by the Board of Elections, you may have been transferred to another polling site in our municipality for this election. No Town of Fletcher voting will be held at the Board of Elections office on Election Day. All Fletcher precincts will be open from 6:30am to 7:30pm on November 5, 2019
