### News from the September Town Council Meeting

The meeting was held in the Council Chambers but social distancing guidelines and mass gathering recommendations were followed.

- Erik Summey, Police Chief, recognized Sergeant David Hensley for his July retirement from the Fletcher Police Department and presented him with his side arm and badge.
- A Public Hearing was held regarding the possible Town purchase of a parcel of land on Highway 25 owned by NC DOT. Mark Biberdorf, Town Manager, explained that due to the property's location, it would aid in the Town Center project and assist with Town economic development efforts. The Town placed a \$500 bid on the property which was to be auctioned.
- Mark Biberdorf, Town Manager, reported on a request made by Town staff in early September for a NC DOT traffic study of Fanning Bridge Road where it intersects with Snowball Lane, Sunflower Lane, and Lilac Lane. While awaiting the study results, he shared that our Public Works Department did trim some of the vegetation along this area of Fanning Bridge in hopes of immediately improving sight distances for drivers pulling out from the adjoining streets even though the maintenance of this area is a DOT responsibility. Mr. Biberdorf furthermore shared that Lonnie Watkins, the DOT District Engineer in our area, had contacted him and relayed that the DOT Safety Committee met in early September and reviewed the five-year accident history of this area back to 2015. With none of the three reported accidents having resulted from drivers turning from these 3 intersecting roads onto Fanning Bridge Road or other major detriments to traffic movement in this specific location, Mr. Watkins explained it would not guality for any DOT safety improvements. However, he did share that the actuated flasher at the nearby intersection of Rutledge Road and Fanning Bridge Road had been approved for replacement to a permanent traffic signal. He was unsure of the exact timeframe for the installation of the traffic signal, however, due to funding considerations.

#### **One-Stop Voting Begins October 15th**

Fletcher Town Hall will serve as a Henderson County One-Stop Voting site for the General Election from October 15<sup>th</sup> - October 31<sup>st</sup>. This site will be open Monday through Friday from 8:00 am - 7:30 pm and on Saturday the 17<sup>th</sup> and 24<sup>th</sup> from 8:00 am - 6:00 pm. On Saturday October 31<sup>st</sup>, the hours will be 8:00 am - 3:00 pm. ## North Carolina Moved to Phase 2.5

Governor Cooper's Executive Order #163 moved NC to Phase 2.5 on September 4<sup>th</sup> and remains in effect through 5:00pm on October 2<sup>nd</sup>. Three changes in this Order have positively impacted the Town of Fletcher parks including: mass gathering limits increased to 25 people indoors and 50 people outdoors and playgrounds re-opening. These changes have increased the group size for Steelcase Shelter reservations, opened the playground and fitness pad at Bill Moore Community Park, and opened Kate's Shelter and playground located at Kate's Park on Library Road (beside the Fletcher Library). Please remember that mask mandates and other prevention methods remain in effect with this latest order.

As of 9/25/20, the 28732 zip code has reported 121 COVID cases.

#### Fletcher Area Water System Improvements

The "Northside Water System Improvements Project", as part of the Hendersonville Water Capital Improvement Plan, began in late September and will improve water pressure and system capacity for the north end of the County. Water service in the Fletcher (Northside) area will be improved by creating a new pressure zone with a new ground storage tank at a higher elevation and a water booster station to feed the new ground storage tank. A new ground storage tank will be constructed adjacent to the existing ground storage tank, located off Burney Mountain Road, but with a new overflow elevation of 2,375 feet (about 70' higher than the existing tank) with a storage capacity of 1.0 million gallons like the existing tank. The ground storage tank will be served by a water booster station, which will be constructed south of the US 25 and Howard Gap Road intersection on Woodhill Drive. The 1,750 gallons-perminute water booster station will fill the tank during offpeak hours and provide additional flow during peak demands. The construction of the proposed water booster station will include approximately 1,500 linear feet of 12-inch water main along Woodhill Drive to serve as suction and discharge piping between the proposed water booster station and the existing 16-inch water main on US 25. The contractor, M.B. Kahn Construction, estimates a target completion date of May 2021.

#### Fall Leaf Pickup Begins October 5th

If the leaves have starting falling around your property and you are ready to pile them up before they pile up on you, then starting raking and bagging and



give us a call. Please do not include grass clippings, pampas grass, mulch, dirt, or rocks with the leaves since the leaves will be recycled. Call 828-654-9208, 24 hours a day 7 days a week, to reach the Public Works' message recorder to request a leaf pickup. You may also complete a pickup request online at https://www.fletchernc.org/leaf-brush-pickup/. If you would rather talk to a person, call Town Hall at 828-687-3985 during normal business hours and request your leaf pickup. Public Works will pick up bagged leaves every Monday through December 28th.

#### Proper leaf disposal, please...

Although raking leaves can be a great workout (30 minutes of raking can burn about 150 calories) most



people want to complete this task as soon as possible. However, please do not take a short cut disposal method of dumping your leaves down a storm drain or by placing loose

leaves in a drainage ditch or in the gutter.

The Town of Fletcher has an ordinance prohibiting "illicit discharges" into the storm drain system. Leaves, brush, lawn clippings, and other yard waste are considered an illicit discharge that can affect water quality. The Town can issue fines to citizens who violate this ordinance.

Beyond contacting us to pick up your bagged leaves (see article above), there are a couple of other disposal methods. For example, you can use your lawn mower to reduce the leaves to small bits that can be left on the lawn as added nutrients for the soil; add the leaves to your mulch or compost pile; or, use them as a winter cover for your garden or kindling for your outdoor fire pit.
