## News from the August 9<sup>th</sup> Town Council Meeting

- By Consent Agenda, Town Council:
- Reappointed Keith Reed to a three-year term on the Planning Board effective August 13, 2021.
- Approved a reduced bond for improvement guarantees in Phase 2 of Sycamore Cottages.
- Approved Resolution # R-21-07 to sell surplus property on www.govdeals.com.
- Approved Erik Weber for a three-year term, to expire August 9, 2024, on the Parks & Recreation Advisory Board.
- Approved Budget Ordinance Amendment #1 for fiscal year 2021/2022 for the purchase of a garbage truck.
- Approved Grant Project Ordinance # 0-21-09 for the Town of Fletcher Coronavirus State and Local Fiscal Recovery Funds.
- Approved the extension of Baabal's concession operation lease at Bill Moore Community Park for two weekends in September at a cost of \$200.
- Fletcher Police Chief Dan Terry presented a Unit Citation to five members of the Fletcher Police Department who were involved in a complex investigation beginning in February 2021. Their efforts exhibited successful coordination and teamwork and ultimately resulted in the identification and arrest of offenders involved in a local service station break-in plus crimes in Shelby, NC and in two Georgia communities.
- Ashlynn McCoy, Director of Housing Assistance Corporation, shared a presentation
  on the mission and services offered by this non-profit organization whose goal is to
  provide safe and affordable housing for persons of limited income living in
  Henderson County.
- Councilman Preston Blakely presented Resolution # R-21-08 in support of North Carolina election redistricting reform. Town Council approved the resolution.
- Mark Biberdorf, Town Manager, provided an update on two types of public-private partnership agreements being considered for the Fletcher Town Center Project. One option is an economic development agreement (EDA) which spells out the type of development expected and the Town's responsibilities in the deal. An EDA has been presented to the developer and we are anticipating a meeting to work out additional details or revisions. The second type is a purchase and sale agreement (PSA) which spells out specific steps and a timeline toward the sale of the property. Our Town attorney is still completing the draft of the PSA for Council's approval. We hope to have both the EDA and PSA for Council's formal approval in September.
- Mark Biberdorf shared that a recent meeting of the Local Government Committee
  for Cooperative Action (LGCCA) it was suggested that there be some level of
  discussion between the municipalities and Henderson County on the joint use of the
  American Rescue Plan (ARP) funds. It was recommended to form a committee with
  one elected representative from each respective jurisdiction. Mayor Rod Whiteside
  agreed to serve as the ARP Committee representative from the Town of Fletcher.

#### **HOLIDAY SCHEDULE CHANGES**

Fletcher Town Hall will be closed Monday, September 6, 2021 in observance of Labor Day. No trash or recycling routes will be impacted by this closure. Brush will be picked up that week beginning on Tuesday, September 7th.

Our September Town Council Agenda Review Meeting will be held Tuesday, September 7th at 6:00 p.m. rather than Monday September 6th.



#### 2021 Tax Bill Information

2021 Town of Fletcher property tax bills were mailed on August 11th. If you own real estate or personal property in the Town of Fletcher and you have not received a 2021 tax bill, please contact us at 828-687-3985. Per NC General Statute, your taxes are still due and payable even if you do not receive a bill. If you know your roll number, you may obtain a copy of your bill from our website at <a href="https://www.fletchernc.org/departments/finance/property-taxes/">https://www.fletchernc.org/departments/finance/property-taxes/</a>. If you do not know you roll number, please contact us.

**REMINDER**: If you sold property this year, please do not automatically assume that you do not owe 2021 taxes. If the sale occurred **after January 1, 2021**, you were the owner of record as of January 1st so, per NC tax laws, you are responsible for the 2021 taxes.

- For real estate you sold <u>or</u> bought in 2021, check your closing statement or with your closing attorney to ensure your portion of the 2021 taxes were included in your real estate closing since property taxes are generally prorated between the buyer and seller. Remember... if you received a 2021 tax bill, your 2021 taxes were not paid as of the date we mailed the bill.
- For personal property, such as a boat, trailer, unlicensed vehicle, etc., you sold **after 1/1/21**, you are still responsible for the 2021 taxes because you were the owner as of January 1st. Also please realize that for any boat, trailer, etc. which you sold in a previous year but the title was not transferred to the buyer, you will receive the 2021 tax bill since the property is still in your name -- so don't forget to transfer any titles.

If you have questions about your bill or the property being taxed, please contact us at 828-687-3985. Although we are happy to answer your tax related questions at any time, there is a 30-day window granted by NC General Statute in which tax bills can be adjusted due to specific documentation you provide. After that timeframe, the approval of any tax adjustments becomes more complicated.

- \*\* When Bill Moore Community Park floods due to Cane Creek overflowing its banks, our Public Works and Parks & Recreation Departments work as quickly as possible to clean up the debris and make repairs in order to open the Park back up for your enjoyment. In order to expedite the cleaning and repair and keep everyone safe, please observe all barricades and caution tape being utilized to block off

areas in which we are working. We greatly appreciate your cooperation in this matter.


