#### **News from the February 14th Town Council Meeting**

- Town Council recognized Mr. Robert Lance, outgoing member of the Fletcher Planning Board / Zoning Board of Adjustment, for his six years of service on the Board.
- Bob Davy, Mayor Pro-Tem, shared project updates from a recent NC DOT meeting he attended. He noted that the project bid let date for the installation of the signal light at Fanning Bridge and Rutledge Road is set for October 2022.
- By Consent Agenda, Town Council:
  - Approved property tax releases from the Henderson County Tax Office.
  - Reappointed George Clayton to the Fletcher Planning Board / Zoning Board of Adjustment for another 3-year term.
  - Approved the audit contract with Lowdermilk & Church for the 2021/2022 fiscal year at a cost of \$17,000.
  - Approved Resolution R-22-01 for the financing terms of a new garbage truck at \$300,000 for a 3-year 1.45% interest loan with Truist bank.
  - Approved the 2021 year-end Tax Collector's report and approved the advertisement of delinquent property tax owners in March 2022, per NC GS § 105-369.
- Town Council held a secret ballot election for three current Planning Board / Zoning Board of Adjustment vacancies for the District 2 seat and two at-large vacancies.
   Lee Bowser was elected for the District 2 seat with James Bruggeman and Jeff Groh being elected to the at-large seats.
- Mark Biberdorf, Town Manager, provided an update on the approximate \$2.6 million 2021 American Rescue Plan (ARP) allocation received from the Federal government which the Town has been holding in a separate bank account until a determination can be made on eligible projects to fund. Town Staff had previously discussed several project areas for consideration while awaiting the final rule determination from the Federal Government. With the final ruling having been released, Mr. Biberdorf explained that Staff now recommends the following projects: (1) a 1.3 mile trail extension of the Cane Creek / Meritor Greenway and (2) a multi-use facility for the Fletcher Library, EMS, and a satellite community college located on the north side of Town Hall on the Town Center property. This proposed facility would provide space for these three organizations with the Town partnering with Henderson County to utilize a portion of their ARP allocation for this project. Town Council voted to send a letter to the Henderson County Board of Commissioners to formally request their consideration of the multi-use facility project.
- Ben Cathey from McGill Associates discussed the bids received for our Powell Bill Street Projects, with Tarheel Paving being the lowest bid at \$329,609. Since the bid was over our budgeted amount however, Staff recommended that the approximate \$57,000 difference be taken from our Powell Bill Reserve account. Council approved Tarheel Paving as our contractor and also using a portion of the Powell Bill Reserve funds for the three street resurfacing projects of Glensprings Drive, Barrington Court, and Hedgewood Court and the culvert pipe replacement on Belmont Drive.

#### February 14th Town Council Meeting (continued)

- Mark Biberdorf shared the bid results for the demolition services associated with the sale of certain Town Center properties on Hendersonville Road. Town Council approved D.H. Griffin Wrecking Company, Inc. as the lowest bid at a cost of \$168,000.
- Mayor Preston Blakely presented a proposal for consideration by Council regarding an employee paid family leave plan for up to six weeks. Town Council approved the Paid Family Leave Policy as presented.

#### Keith Reed, Newest Town Council Member

Keith Reed, elected by Town Council on January 24th to fill the vacant District 2 Council seat, was sworn into office as a Town Council member on February 7th during the Agenda Review Meeting.

#### Almost Time for Spring Leaf Pickup

Public Works will pick up bagged leaves two weeks in the Spring starting April 4th and 11th. Public Works has a limited supply of free mulch that is currently available to Town residents on a "first come, first serve basis". Just bring a shovel and a container and come to Parrish Municipal Drive. The mulch pile is beside the green metal building, on the left, after turning off of Howard Gap Road.

#### Who Do I Call with Water Issues/Questions?

Hendersonville Water & Sewer (HW&S) provides the water and maintains the water lines in the Town of Fletcher. If you have a problem with your water, please call 828-697-3073 from 9:00am - 5:00pm or outside of those hours call their Emergency # at 828-891-7779. HW&S will notify customers of outages and boil water advisories, via their notification system, using customer contact information provided when customers initially signed up for water service. If you need to update your phone numbers or email address, please contact Customer Service at 828-697-3052 Monday-Friday from 9am - 5pm or via email at <a href="mailto:customerservice@hvlnc.gov">customerservice@hvlnc.gov</a>. You can provide a home, mobile, and work phone number along with an email address so more than one person at your residence can be informed of issues affecting your water. #### **Help Keep Our Water Clean**

Stormwater runoff is water from rain or melting snow that "runs off" across the land into the nearest stream, creek, river, or lake instead of seeping into the ground. On its way, runoff can pick up and carry many substances that pollute including pesticides, fertilizers, oil, pet waste, leaves, and grass clippings, The runoff may also include sediment from construction sites, bare

soil, dirt roads, or agricultural lands. Water runoff is also created by watering outdoor plants, car-washing, cleaning decks or pavement, or any other activity that puts a lot of water on the ground.



Beyond picking up pollutants, stormwater runoff is also polluted by dumping into storm drains and from illegal (illicit) hook-ups to the pipes that carry rainwater to the streams. The Town of Fletcher has an ordinance to prevent these "illicit discharges". to the Police Department should go to Administration, on the 2nd floor of Town Hall, for walk-in police services rather than going to the Police Department lobby. Police services can also be obtained by calling the main police number at 828-687-7922.

- ▶ Visitors to Town Hall should utilize the elevator to access the 2nd and 3rd floors or should enter through the front door, rather than utilizing the back hallway stairs from the ground floor.
- ▶ The Community Room is currently unavailable to the public for use as a meeting room.


As noted, the above changes are only temporary until the repair work is completed. Thank you for your patience.

#### FEMA Updates Shelter Locator Texting Feature

None of us ever want to be faced with a disaster that requires evacuation from our homes, but the Federal Emergency Management Agency has updated a resource that you, or a loved one living apart from you, might find helpful. The below information is copied from a February 8, 2022, FEMA Press Release:

"Having the right information at the right time is often key to surviving a disaster. FEMA's updated texting feature allows the public to access shelter addresses when they need it most. Users can text "shelter" and their **ZIP** code to 43362 to get a list of nearby shelter locations. This effort is made possible through collaboration with the American Red Cross.

"Disasters frequently disrupt communications systems which can leave survivors feeling overwhelmed and helpless when they are trying to locate shelters," said FEMA Administrator Deanne Criswell. "Since texting capabilities are often unaffected during disasters, our updated Text to Shelter option is an easy and accessible way survivors can locate nearby shelters with a tap of a button. This feature will help keep our communities safe."

FEMA's old text feature only showed shelters within the requested ZIP code. This new feature uses Geographic Information System (GIS) capabilities to give users shelter addresses within 200 miles of their ZIP code. The texting feature is available across all 50 states and U.S. territories. Standard texting rates with the user's carrier may apply, but there is no additional fee to use this service. In phones with a standard map feature, users will be able to click on the shelter address inside the text message and view directions. The text can be easily shared with friends and family so they know where the user is going or where they themselves can take shelter. Disasters can strike anywhere, anytime. Save this number, 43362, in your phone today so you'll be able to find a safe space to shelter during a disaster."
