News from the April 11th Town Council Meeting

- Adam Steurer, City of Hendersonville Utilities Engineer, provided an update on the completed Northside Water Improvements project. This project, as part of the Hendersonville Water Capital Improvement Plan, added a new water storage tank off Burney Mountain Road and a water booster station on Woodhill Drive. These improvements should have already been noticed by Fletcher residents due to an increase in water pressure and system capacity.
- A Public Hearing was held to consider Conditional Zoning Application # 2022-01 from Long Shoals Partners, LLC to conditionally rezone portions of 3056, 3086, and 3122 Hendersonville Road from C-1 and R-2 to Neighborhood Business District (NBD) for an 87 unit multi-family development located on 5.45 acres. The residential complex would be located on the rear of the property with the Hendersonville Road frontage property being commercially developed for office and retail use. Town Council members discussed concerns over potential traffic issues, the affordability of the rent, the addition of more apartments in Fletcher, and the use of green space within the complex. The Town Council approved the application by a 3 to 1 vote.
- Will Buie, with WGLA Engineering, provided a quarterly update from the developer of the Town Center project. His comments included that the overall project development focus remains the same at two 2-story residential buildings, two 2-story mixed use buildings, and two single story mixed use buildings; the project completion will be done in phases; and phase 1 initial objectives remain as the removal of existing buildings, clearing and grading the site, construction of Triangle Stop, and construction of a road access through the property.
- Police Chief Dan Terry provided an overview of recent organizational structure changes within the Fletcher Police department.
- The Henderson County Apple Country Public Transit system submitted a fiscal year 2022-2023 funding request of \$12,854 to the Town of Fletcher. Town Council made no decision on an exact funding amount but will address it at the upcoming Annual Budget Meeting on May 4th.
- Town Council then entered into a Closed Session regarding contract matters.



Holiday Closing

Town Hall will be closed May 30, 2022 in observance of Memorial Day. No trash or recycling routes will be impacted by this holiday observance. We will begin picking up brush that week on Tuesday, May 31st.

Drivers Beware

DANGER The intersection at Hendersonville Road and Old Airport Road seems to be perilous for some drivers. The Fletcher Police Department has already responded to 12 accidents in that area this year, equating to 1 accident every 9 days, which has involved 34 persons. This compares to a total of 36 accidents in that area in 2021 and 21 accidents in 2020. The accidents have involved persons from ages 18 - 68, at all hours of the day and past midnight, in all types of weather conditions, and for all sorts of reasons. However driver inattention, driver impatience, and no clear line of sight seems to be the main reasons for these accidents. Other witnessed improper driver actions, such as running stoplights and driving north into oncoming southbound traffic due to turning left before the median rather than after it, may not have resulted in accidents but has definitely created close calls.

To keep you from becoming an intersection statistic:

- 1 Drive defensively when approaching and entering the intersection.
- 2 Don't anticipate the changing of the red light.
- 3 If you cannot clearly see that there is no southbound oncoming traffic...wait to turn when you can see, rather than taking a chance when turning left into Ingles. Be patient, you will have an opportunity to make your left turn safely.

It's Primary Election Time

From the Office of the Chief:

With the warmer months approaching and people starting to make those summer vacation plans, I wanted to remind residents



that house checks can be requested on our website. Certainly, you can continue to call or drop by Town Hall to request a vacation check of your home. However, another convenient, quick and easy way is to go to https://www.fletchernc.org/departments/police/house-check-request/ and submit your request on our website.

In addition, you can use our website to leave a "crime tip" if there is information you desire to share. Just last month, a local robbery was solved by a citizen willing to help our department by sharing valuable information that eventually led to the arrest of a serious and violent criminal. You can leave your name if you don't mind taking follow up questions from an officer or you can remain confidential. It's your choice.

And finally, we are still looking for good applicants that would like to join the team at the Fletcher Police Department. Job applications can also be submitted on our website.

Another form of candidate communication is campaign signage. Since Fletcher Town Hall is a One-Stop, In-Person Early Voting location and a polling site, we allow candidates to place their signs in front of Town Hall. However, since we also want Town Hall to look nice for our residents and visitors, we need to continue mowing the grass. Therefore at this time of the year, campaign signs will only be allowed at certain locations in front of Town Hall. If you are a campaign volunteer, please be aware of the following allowable placement locations as also indicated on a map posted to the left of the front doors of Town Hall. Campaign signs may be placed to the right of Old Cane Creek Road on the side closest to the railroad tracks. However, they do need to be placed in the mulched area around the trees so the signs will not be in the way of mowing. Signs should also not be placed in the median in front of Town Hall nor in the flower beds. Improperly placed signs will be relocated, space permitting, or completely removed if space is not available. Thank you for your cooperation.





Littering Impacts All of Us

Littering truly is a dirty habit which is also illegal with fines as the penalty if you are caught littering. But some litterbugs may only need to be reminded that littering, whether due to deliberate carelessness or unintentional acts, is relatively easy to stop simply by exercising the proper personal choice.

Cleaning up litter is costly to the State of NC. In 2021, our State spent over \$19 million in trash removal. It is quite obvious that litter creates an eyesore and can create an image problem for a community. Littering can also be dangerous by harming the environment, endangering wildlife, hurting economic development opportunities, and creating a public safety hazard. Litter and debris blowing from unsecured loads can strike other vehicles, obscure a driver's vision, damage vehicles, injure drivers, and cause drivers to lose control of their vehicle due to swerving to miss debris.

Here are some actionable ways in which you can make a difference in littering in our Town:

- Set a good example and don't litter so your children, and soon to be young drivers, won't pick up a bad habit.
- Always cover truck and trailer beds when transporting trash or other loose items.
- Carry and use a litter/trash bag in your vehicle so you won't be tempted to toss trash out of your window.
- Lead a group of neighbors to help keep your street or subdivision clean to directly impact littering.
- Report litterbugs when you see them to the <u>NCDOT</u> Swat-A-Litterbug program.

NC DOT Swat-A-Litterbug Application

The Swat-A-Litterbug app allows users to easily report when someone sees trash being thrown from a vehicle. The owner of the vehicle will receive a formal notification from the N.C. State Highway Patrol informing them about the littering offense, as well as the penalties for littering, and a note urging them to help keep NC clean.

North Carolinians can access the app by visiting ncdot.gov/litter. First time mobile users will be given pop-up instructions on how to add a shortcut to their phone's home screen. This will add an icon that, when clicked, will take users directly to the Swat-A-Litterbug form. The Swat-A-Litterbug app will only be available through ncdot.gov/litter and any related shortcut links.

NCDOT's Swat-A-Litterbug Program has been in operation for over 30 years, allowing the public to take an active role in keeping NC's roadways clean. 2022 Primary Election Voting

Information taken from the State and Henderson County Board of Elections Websites

Fletcher Town Hall will be one of four 1-Stop Early Voting sites in Henderson Co. for the Primary election. Early voting starts on April 28, 2022 from 8:00am - 7:30pm and continues Monday - Friday until early voting ends on Saturday, May 14th with the hours of 8:00am - 3:00pm.

May 17, 2022 is Election Day with polls open from 6:30 am - 7:30 pm. There are 3 assigned polling places for Fletcher residents on Election Day: Fletcher Town Hall, Fletcher Elementary School, and Fletcher 7th Day Adventist Church. Please ensure you go to your correct voting location.

In the Primary Election, voters will select nominees for a political party for the November 8th General Election. Contests in the Primary include U.S. Senate and House of Representatives, N.C. General Assembly, state and local judges, and county offices. Voters affiliated with a political party will be given a ballot of candidates for their party. Unaffiliated voters may choose a ballot of candidates for any party primary. To become the party's nominee, the candidate must win by at least 30% of the vote plus one. If no candidate reaches the total necessary to become the party nominee, a second primary may be needed on July 26th.
