News from the July 11th Fletcher Town Council Meeting

- By Consent Agenda, Town Council:
 - Reappointed and charged Tax Collector Cynthia Broome to collect 2022-2023 property taxes for the Town of Fletcher.
 - Approved revisions to the Town's personnel handbook to include an update to the tuition assistance program.
 - Approved the 2021-2022 year-end Tax Collector's report.
- Lew Bleiweis, Executive Director of the Asheville Regional Airport, shared an annual update of Asheville Airport activities.
- Mark Biberdorf, Town Manager, shared a Town Council requested report on the process for amending electoral district lines in Fletcher. The Town's population has significantly changed since its incorporation in 1989 but the electoral districts have not been adjusted, except for annexations. NC General Statute 160A-23 provides Town Council the authority to revise electoral districts from time to time, but there is no requirement to adjust voting district boundaries if the population within districts has changed. No action was taken on this information.
- Mark Biberdorf presented a resolution authorizing the Mayor and/or Town Manager to negotiate an extension of the Town Center project purchase and sale agreement with the developer. This is due to ongoing due diligence matters related to transportation improvements impacting the project. Council approved a closing date extension to August 31, 2022 for developer SDW and JHW, LLC.
- Christine Thompson, Town Clerk, shared a suggested updated policy for appointments to Town of Fletcher volunteer boards. The suggestions covered the recruitment, the selection, and the expectations of board appointees. Town Council approved the updated policy changes.
- Mark Biberdorf shared updates on several matters:
 - The Police involved in-custory death at the Seasons at Cane Creek Apartments is still under investigation by the SBI and could take a few more months to complete.
 - Fern Leaf School has inquired about the possibility of the Town of Fletcher annexing the school's satellite campus on Old Hendersonville Road.
 - The Town has received a de-annexation request of a satellite parcel that was taken into the Town limits in 1999. The N.C. General Assembly will have to be involved in any such action.
 - Town staff contacted the Metropolitan Sewer District (MSD) about the possibility of using a portion of our ARP funding for sewer extension to unserved areas in Fletcher. A rough initial estimated cost would be at least \$615,000 which did not include pavement repair or easement costs.
 - The next Local Government Committee for Cooperative Action (LGCCA) meeting will be July 19th at 3:00pm at the Historic Courthouse.

Your Tax Dollars at Work

The major revenue sources for the operation of the Town of Fletcher and the services we will provide during 2022-2023 are projected to come from property taxes (55%), local sales tax (26%), State sources such as shared utility sales tax, cable franchise taxes, and NC DOT (12%), and roughly 7% from other miscellane-ous Town fees and revenue sources.

In 2021, the <u>average</u> residential real estate tax bill for an individually owned property with a house was \$732. Since the property tax rate will remain at 34¢ per \$100 of property valuation during 2022-2023, below is how your \$732 will be spent.

As shown, \$491 (or 67%) provides the personnel and equipment for direct resident services such as fire protection, police protection, trash collection, recycling pickup, Town street repair, street lighting, brush removal, leaf removal, the operation of two Town parks and a Summer Day Camp, and other recreational activities. \$124 (17%) covers administrative costs such as salaries and expenses for Town Council and Town Staff, information technology, economic development efforts, stormwater programs, Town Hall utility bills, and professional services such as legal fees and accounting audits. The remaining \$117 (16%) is used for debt service on existing capital projects or new projects for the benefit of our residents.



2022 Property Tax Bills Are on Their Way

We expect the Town of Fletcher property tax bills to be mailed out in early August. If you own property and pay your own taxes, rather than having them escrowed with your mortgage company, you should receive a tax bill. If you do not, please contact us at 828-687-3985. Remember, in NC you are still responsible for paying your taxes even if you do not receive a bill.

Where do I recycle "hard to recycle" items? White goods such as refrigerators, washers, dryers, etc. can be picked up by Public Works by calling 828-654-9208 or by visiting <u>https://www.fletchernc.org/departments/</u> <u>public-works/white-goods-pick/</u>.

Scanners, printers, telephones, stereos, keyboards, game consoles, etc. can be taken to the Henderson County Convenience Center at 265 Convenience Center Drive in Hendersonville 28791.

Carpet, linoleum, other types of flooring, mattresses, and furniture can be take to the Henderson County Transfer station at 191 Transfer Station Drive in Hendersonville. TVs and computer monitors are also accepted for a \$20 per item fee.

From the Office of the Chief:

Recently, the police department has responded to two separate incidents where elderly members of our community have been conned



out of a significant amount of money. These scams started with a simple, but convincing phone call. In one case, the victim was told she won a vehicle and the other was told they had won a million dollars through the Publishers Clearing House. Victims were requested to pay taxes on their winnings to receive their awards. The requested money was paid and then more phone calls and requests for money were made of them. And of course, they never received their promised awards.

The FPD asks that you help us in preventing this type of vile offense by remembering that "if it sounds too good to be true, it probably is." Our elderly residents work too hard to make a good life for themselves, bring up their children, and invest in their community to then be victimized in such a way. Help us help them. Take care of yourself and look out for your friends, neighbors, and loved ones. Have those difficult conversations, if necessary, to protect the ones you care for.
