News from the November 10th Town Council Meeting

- By Consent Agenda, Town Council:
 - Approved property tax releases from the Henderson County Tax Office.
 - Approved Budget Amendment #1 to the FEMA project original grant ordinance # 0-24-06 to increase the park repair line item to account for additional engineering related costs, to finalize the remaining park projects, and to increase the FEMA Public Assistance line item.
 - Approved Resolution R-25-09 appointing Susan Heafner as Deputy Finance Officer due to the retirement of the current Deputy Finance Officer, Cynthia Broome.
 - Approved Resolution R-25-10 appointing Susan Heafner as Tax Collector effective January 1, 2026, upon the retirement of the current Tax Collector, Cynthia Broome, on December 31, 2025, after 35 years of service with the Town.
- The Town contracted with McGill Associates to provide a conceptual Master Plan for the greenway trail expansion from Bill Moore Community Park westward, terminating at the I-26 bridge. McGill's proposal would add approximately three additional miles of trail to the existing system at the Park and provide connectively to a potential future regional trail system at an estimated total project cost of \$3,279,583. Ben Cathey with McGill Associates presented their Master Plan, which divides the project into six sections, along with a recommendation to proceed with full design and bidding for Sections 3 and 4 of the plan along with Section 1 as an alternate if the bid results are favorable and the Town has available funds. The Town currently has \$900,000 available for the greenway extension due to two grants and matching Town funds plus \$100,000 currently budgeted in the Capital Improvement Plan. The construction of Sections 3 and 4 would provide a new trailhead location (with a parking lot) off Rockwell Drive, a new 1.1 mile loop soft walking trail, and connectivity to the existing sidewalk system on Highway 25 at an estimated cost of \$872,103. If Section 1 was also affordable at this time, it would provide a trail from Bill Moore Park along Fernleaf School property and Cane Creek with a turnaround at the railroad bridge at Highway 25. Council agreed to vote on this proposal at their December meeting.
- Mark Biberdorf, Town Manager, shared that he would be updating the Five-Year Capital Improvement Plan (CIP) to cover the period from fiscal year 2026-2027 through fiscal year 2030-2031 and asked for input from Council Members on any projects they would like to be considered in this plan.
- The Town has received one Stormwater Off-Right-of-Way Grant program application from the resident at 96 Wilkie Way. The Town Advisory Panel recommended funding this \$6,110 stormwater improvement project with the Town covering of 90% of the cost, per program guidelines. Council approved the recommendation.
- Mark Biberdorf provided updates on several issues:
 - Fletcher Public Works has completed the removal of 7 stump piles remaining from Helene which the State had not yet contracted for removal.
 - Mr. Biberdorf would like for Town Council members to meet with our new Planning/Zoning Director, Tyler Morrow, to share their individual perspectives on land use and development within Fletcher.
 - Chief Griffin of the Fletcher Fire Department has contacted the Town about the Town establishing some regulation standards in gated residential communities pertaining to gate access and public access in the event of an emergency within the community.
- Two locations on Highway 25 were mentioned as having dips in the road which need maintenance attention. NC DOT will be contacted regarding these locations.

Henderson Co. Board of Elections News

Candidate filing for contests subject to a possible primary election in the March 2026 statewide primary begins at noon on Monday, December 1, 2025, and ends at noon Friday, December 19, 2025. This December filing deadline also includes three Fletcher Council seats up for re-election in November 2026:

- Mayor (incumbent Preston Blakely)
- Council District 1 (incumbent Amber McKinney)
- Council District 4 (incumbent Trevor Lance)

Residents wishing to file must reside in the same district as the district seat they are filing for and they may live in any Fletcher district for the Mayoral race. All seats are for a four-year term.

2025 Property Taxes Due in January

2025 property taxes are due on or before January 5, 2026 to avoid 2% interest which will be applied to all unpaid balances on January 6th. Mailed payments must display a USPS postmark prior to 1/6/26 to avoid interest. You may also pay your taxes online at www.fletchernc.org/departments/finance/property-taxes/, in person at Fletcher Town Hall via cash, check or money order, or place your payment in our southside parking lot drop box 24 hours a day.

Planning Board/ZBA ETJ Vacancy

The Town of Fletcher is seeking to fill a vacancy on the Planning Board & Zoning Board of Adjustment for the Extra-Territorial Jurisdiction (ETJ) of Fletcher. Applications and applicants will first be reviewed by Council, and a recommendation will be made to the County Commissioners, who will appoint the recommended individual. Anyone living in the ETJ and interested in applying may access the application at https://www.fletchernc.org/town-government/town-committees/board-openings/ or by contacting the Town Clerk or Planning Director at 828-687-3985. You may also call Tyler Morrow, the Planning Director, if you are unsure if you live in the ETJ. The application period will remain open until the vacancy is filled.

Functions of the Planning Board include recommendations to the Town Council on applications related to Rezoning, Conditional Rezoning, Special Use Permits, and text amendments to the Town's Land Development Code. The Board also reviews preliminary plats for major subdivisions and design review for projects in the "Heart of Fletcher" overlay. Functions of the ZBA include quasi-judicial hearings regarding applications for variances and appeals on zoning matters. The Board typically meets once per month, on the 3rd Tuesday at 6:00 pm.

Bagged Leaf & Christmas Tree Pickup

Fletcher Public Works is picking up bagged leaves from now until the end of December. Please do not include any sticks, rocks, dirt, trash, etc. in your leaf bags since the leaves will be mulched.
